**RECIPES FROM  
CLYDE'S  
COUNTRY  
KITCHEN:**



**CHICKEN POT PIE**

1 cup celery, chopped  
 1 cup onion, chopped  
 1 cup carrots, chopped  
 8 ounces mushrooms, chopped, if desired  
 1/3 cup butter or margarine  
 1/2 cup flour  
 2 cups chicken broth  
 1 cup half and half  
 1 tsp garlic salt  
 garlic powder, thyme, poultry seasoning to taste  
 1/4 tsp pepper  
 4 cups chicken, cooked & chopped  
*Sauté' onion, celery, and carrot in butter for 10 minutes. Add flour to sautéed mixture, stirring well. Cook one minute, stirring constantly. Stir in seasonings. Add chopped chicken, stirring well. Pour into greased 9x13 pan. Top with pastry; make slits to let steam escape. Bake at 400 degrees for 40 minutes, until bubbly and brown. Makes 6-8 servings.*

**Basic Pastry:**

1 cup flour                      1/3 cup plus 1 T Crisco  
 1/2 tsp salt                      2-3 T ice cold water  
*Combine flour and salt in bowl; cut in shortening with pastry blender until mixture resembles coarse meal. Sprinkle cold water evenly over the surface; stir with a fork until all dry ingredients are moistened. Shape into a ball and chill. Roll pastry on a floured surface to fit pan. Yields enough for a 9x13 pan.*


**Lower Fat Version:**

- Use canola oil instead of butter
- Fat free half and half instead of regular
- Combine broth and half and half, gradually stir into vegetable mixture. Cook over medium heat, stirring constantly, until thickened and bubbly. Stir in salt and pepper


always available on Amazon or at your favorite Christian book store is "Jesus Calling" by Sarah Young.
